Erasmus, Kant and Gandhi - Philosophy on Peace and Prosperity

Abstract:

"*War is sweet to those who have no experience of it ...*" - *Protest against Violence and War* is a new exhibition (2017) dedicated to the humanist and pacifist Desiderius Erasmus (c. 1466-1536), whose anti-war writings "*Dulce bellum inexpertis*" (1515) and "*Querela pacis*" (1517) were published more than five hundred years ago. This exhibition has been recently published, and it is time to introduce this to a wider audience now. Erasmus vividly described the flourishing of economy and society during times of peace: an encouraging vision of the absence of wars, perpetual peace.

In addition, Immanuel Kant's philosophical sketch "*Perpetual Peace*" (1795) shall remind us in which direction international law and politics should find a turning point at last. The visions of both thinkers coincide with Mahatma Gandhi's utopian vision of a peaceful world federation.
